We did manage to find some time of refreshment back up at the cottage following the funeral as well as our annual getaway to Kingdom Bound Christian Music Festival again in August.

The fall saw Murray working closer to home, but with a client where the work environment was unfortunately very stressful involving many long nights and weekends. Nancy continued to run her home business and to teach Prenatal classes. At the church, in addition to Murray and Nancy running the 4th Annual Community BBQ and the Alpha Course, Murray was still involved in the Elders and PRC, which meant a lot of evening meetings. Also the whole family continued to be active within the Music Ministry. We also went through a large number of losses in our church this fall, ranging from funerals of several close friends, to people suffering from major illnesses, to good friends and co-workers moving away.

All in all, it's been a bit of a challenge to get into the Christmas spirit to this point. However with the purchase of a new Christmas tree (after 23 years), the snow and lights in the neighbourhood, and the arrival of all your cards and letters, we all think it's beginning to feel a lot more like Christmas!

We know that just like us, many of *you* are grieving your own losses, and we pray that the love of our Lord will sustain you through the difficult times just as we *know* that He has for us!
